Canine Control – dog tags assist with the recovery of lost dogs as they provide an identification number kept on file at the municipal office. In 2017 we sent out tags with invoices to dog owners. Invoicing will be sent out annually going forward. The tag you received is a permanent tag – if it is lost please contact the office to get a replacement and to advise of any changes. Current fees are \$30 for the first



dog, \$50 for the second and \$100 for the third. By-law No. 32-2016 does not permit more than three dogs per household and requires that all owners purchase a tag within ten days of taking possession of the dog. It also requires owners

do not allow their dogs to run at large, and that owners take reasonable precautions to prevent their dog(s) from biting or attacking a person or domestic animal in a manner that poses a menace to the safety of others.

Garbage/Recycling – please be sure to have your waste/recycling out by 7am on your scheduled collection day. Garbage must be in clear bags and a bag tag must be clearly visible. Tags can be purchased for \$2.50 each at the municipal office, the landfill site, Bare Necessities (Fordwich), Watson's Hardware and D&M Auto (Gorrie) and Abraham Hoover's Harness Shop (44304 Glenannon Road).

Hazardous Waste – can be taken year round to the Mid-Huron Landfill site at 37506A Huron Road (Hwy 8) in Holmesville. For more information contact the County at 519-524-8394 ext.

Property Assessment – the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is run by the Province and is responsible to provide assessments for all properties in Ontario. If you disagree with MPAC's assessment or classification of your property, you can contact MPAC directly to file a Request for Reconsideration (RfR). Howick Fire Department – In a fire seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy. This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign reinforces why an escape plan is so important and here's some key points to include in your plan. Draw a map of your home with all members of the family, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from these exits. Practice your escape plan and teach children how to escape on their own. Always close doors behind you and once outside – stay outside.



2017 Budget Summary – although the Township continues to face reductions in stability funding from the Province, we were pleased to approve a budget with an overall tax rate change of only 2% when combined with the County and Education tax rates for 2017. Township Reserves are budgeted to increase by approximately 8% in 2017, with a significant increase of funds set aside for the fire department. For over a million dollars of capital spending budgeted for 2017, over half of the cost is being paid for from outside funding sources, with the remainder coming mainly from Township Reserves and only a small portion being raised through taxation. Based on the projects budgeted, residents will see improved accessibility at the municipal office, new equipment in place at the fire hall to improve the safety of our firefighters, improvements on several roadways and replaced culverts, a new compressor at the Community Centre for the upcoming ice season and continued improvements and maintenance of our many drains throughout the township. 2016 Audited Financial Statements are available at www.howick.ca.

Final Property Taxes – will be payable in two installments – September 22 and November 24, 2017. Payments are accepted in the form of cash, cheque, Debit and online through your banking institution. To set up online payment, search for "Howick – Township of" as the vendor and use your full 19 digit roll number as your account number. Be sure to leave sufficient time for your payment to reach the township – it often can take up to three business days for electronic payments to come through. Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from the responsibility to pay the taxes, nor does it negate any penalty charges.
